CLIMATE STRIKE

In September 2019, 7 million went out on the streets across the world, workers joining young people in a climate strike of unprecedented size, united in their demand for climate action.

Another global school strike has been called for 29 November. In the UK, this will be just ahead of the general election on 12 December. Young people under the age of 18 have led the way on raising awareness of the climate crisis, but will not be able to vote.

CLIMATE ACTION IN YOUR UNION AND WORKPLACE


Trade union activists mobilised in towns and cities across the UK for the global climate strike on 20 September. New networks have been set up in communities, as well as climate action groups within workplaces, both unionised and non-unionised.

On 29 November, UCU (University and College Union) members on strike over pay and pensions will march to join student climate strikers in towns and cities across the country, standing alongside each other in solidarity.

The first step can be to hold a meeting in your workplace to discuss how you can take action in solidarity on 29 November, for example negotiating time to attend your local school strike event.
